Matthew 16:26: "For what will it profit a man if he gains the whole world and forfeits his (spiritual) life? Or what shall a man give in return for his (spiritual) life?"

Galatians 1:11: "For I would have you know, brethren, that the gospel that was preached by me is not man's gospel."

We regularly monitor and discuss the Church's finances, including income, expenses, cash flows, and surpluses/deficits. These are vital for sustaining our Church. However, a more crucial goal is using our financial resources to prevent spiritual bankruptcy in the community we serve.

Consider the consequences of spiritual bankruptcy:

- a) The *loss of eternity* due to worldly choices, prioritizing the visible over the invisible.
- b) The *value of a saved soul*, far surpassing earthly treasures, highlighting God's supremacy over material wealth.
- c) Upon balancing our spiritual accounts of regular worship, tithing, thanksgiving, brotherly love, humility, generosity, honesty, and integrity, will it reflect a saved or a lost soul?

The current TPC Financial position at the end of October 2023 shows a surplus of R188,000, comprising:

A generous donation of R95,000 ("Malachi moment"); Building fund interest of R65,000; Raffle income of R27,000; June 2023 income of R9,000 (previous year); A tithing income/expenses deficit of R14,000; November income of R6,000 received in October

TPC FNB investment account: R122,000

TPC FNB cheque account: R36,000
